Requirements to vote: No previous attendance at a KTPG meeting is required to be a voter: A voter must have a Registration Form on file before voting. A Registration Form may be filled out on the night of the election. Additionally, a voter must be 18 years of age; and a resident, or a property owner, or a business or non-profit owner or operator, located within the boundaries of the Kensington-Talmadge Planning Group. Voters must bring documentation supporting their eligibility to vote under one of the categories listed above. Most commonly this is accomplished by a current California Drivers License or ID card.
